In its 35th season, the AUSTIN SYMPHONIC BAND is a wind and percussion instrument ensemble composed of 90+ Austin-area musicians dedicated to the artistic performance of a variety of music. Members represent the full spectrum of Austin area citizenry with backgrounds as diverse as the community—doctors, lawyers, white collar and blue collar workers, executives, nurses, teachers, and students. Some thrive on the recognition of performing. Others find playing music a healthy outlet from stressful jobs. The common bond is *music*.

The Band is dedicated to the public performance of band literature, and offers several public and community service concerts each year.

In addition to its Austin area performance schedule, the Band has appeared at the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, the Texas Bandmasters Association Convention in San Antonio, the Texas Music Educators Association Convention in San Antonio, the American Bandmasters Association Convention in New Orleans, the Northwest International Band Clinic in Seattle, and the Association of Concert Bands Convention in Richardson.
